1 2 Ara West Sea Lock Certification Center – Ara Hangang Lock Certification Center

Distance : 21km
Estimated time : 90 minutes
This is a bicycle path built in 2011 along the Ara (the former name of Hangang) waterway connecting the West Sea and Hangang (River). This trail is also called Ara Bicycle Path, and the overall course is flat. Jeongseojin, which is the starting point of the national bicycle path, is located due west of Seoul. An artificial waterfall and the eco park located at the halfway point are popular sights.



2 3 Ara Hangang Lock Certification Center – Mapodaegyo

Distance : 17km

Estimated time : 75 minutes

Banghwadaegyo (Bridge) is a bridge installed at the final point of the downstream Hangang (River) in Seoul, and indicates the entry point to Seoul. There are two bicycle paths at the north and the south of the Hangang. To get to the bicycle path at the north of the Hangang, cyclists need to cross Banghwadaegyo. There are Haengjusanseong and Seoul World Cup Stadium, where the semi-final of the 2002 Korea-Japan World Cup was held near the bicycle path at the north of Hangang. The recommended course is the trail at the south of the Hangang. The southern trail passes Yeouido.



Hiking at Yeouido

Yeouido is an island in the Hangang. Yeouido Park, which is located in front of KBS (Korean Broadcasting System), is a place local residents go to relax, and is also ideal for cyclists. Many visitors can enjoy the Hangang trails on a bike, and can rent bicycles to go from Yeouido Park to Hangang. Visitors can also enjoy a fantastic river view and a night view at the observatory of Seogangdaegyo (Bridge), which is located near Yeouido.







Banpodaegyo (Bridge)

3 4 Mapodaegyo – Seongsudaegyo

Distance : 13km / Estimated time : 60 minutes

Near the path, cyclists can find many popular riverside parks with fantastic views, including Hangang Park Banpo District and Jamwon District; places that tell stories about the history of Korea including Seoul National Cemetery and the National Museum of Korea ; and fashion districts where visitors can experience the true “Gangnam Style,” including Apgujeong-dong and Sinsa-dong. In addition, by crossing the river to the north using the bridge under Banpodaegyo (Bridge) (Jamsugyo (Bridge)), which has a double-structure, cyclists can get to Itaewon Street. Cyclists who want to travel the Gangnam area of Seoul on a bike should go straight after reaching under Banpodaegyo and find the way out at Hannamdaegyo (Bridge) or Donghodaegyo (Bridge).

31 Bridges of Hangang

There are 31 bridges at Hangang (River), which has been called the lifeline of Seoul, as of March 2013, and the number of bridges is growing. Starting with Gangdongdaegyo (Bridge) and ending with Sinhaengjudaegyo (Bridge), each bridge has unique features. There are observatories and cafes at a few bridges of Hangang. Visitors can enjoy a fantastic day view and night view of Hangang and Seoul at the observatories. Cyclists are recommended to drop by an observatory when hiking.



4-5 Seongsudaegyo – Gangdongdaegyo

Distance : 12km / Estimated time : 50 minutes

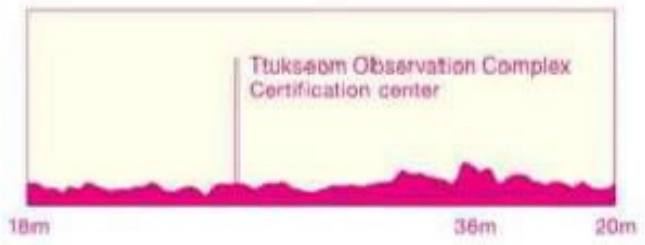
This course leads cyclists to Gangnam-gu, the background to PSY's hit song, Gangnam Style. Here, you can find COEX, the mecca of finance, trade, shopping and culture, which is located in Samseong-dong, Gangnam-gu. Passing through Jamsil Stadium where the 1988 Seoul Olympic Games were held and Hangang Park Jamsil District with its fine view, cyclists are led to Olympic Park, which was built near Seongnaecheon (Stream) to commemorate Seoul Olympic Games through the Olympic-daero. It is recommended to enjoy a short trip to Olympic Park, or to reach Hangang Park Gwangnaru District where Gwangnaru Bicycle Park and Amsa Eco Park are located, if time permits.





Hangang Park Bicycle Rental Services

Hangang Park Bicycle Rental Services are available under the southern end of Banghwadaegyo (Bridge), under the southern end of Mapodaegyo (Bridge), under the southern end of Wonhyodaegyo (Bridge), in front of the cruise dock of Yanghwa District, under the northern end of Seongsandaegyo (Bridge), under the northern end of Cheongdamdaegyo (Bridge), near Geobukseon (Turtle Ship) Ferry of Ichon District and at the Bicycle Park in Gwangnam District.





5 6 Gangdongdaegyo – Paldangdaegyo

Distance : 14km
 Estimated time : 60 minutes
 This is where Seoul and Hangang (River) begins. Bukhangang (River) and Namhangang (River) join to become the Hangang, pass through Seoul, the capital city of Korea, and flow into the West Sea. Hangang begins at Paldangho (Lake), the water source for residents of Seoul. Misa-ri, a famous café district and rowing district, Paldang Resorts and Hangang Sampae District are located near the Hangang. This course covers Gangdong-gu in Seoul and Namyangju and Hanam in Gyeonggi-do.



6-7 Paldangdaegyo – Yangsu Station

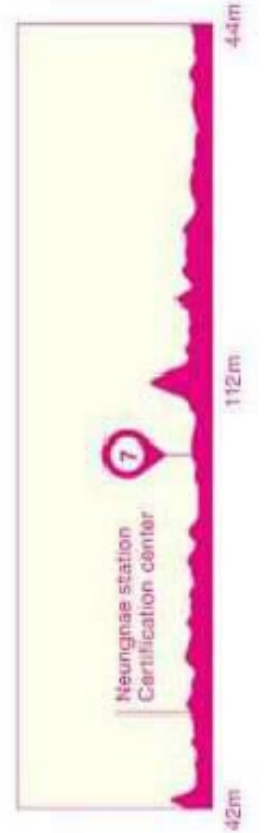
Distance : 12km / Estimated time : 60 minutes

Many cyclists start their itinerary of Namhangang hiking at Paldang Station. Visitors can see a bicycle path built using the old railway of Jungang Line when they go from Paldang Station for a while. This railway bicycle path leads to Yangpyeong. One interesting thing is that there are tunnels on the path, as it was built using the old railway. The first city connected to this path is Yangsuri. Yangsuri means the village where two rivers, Bukhangang and Namhangang, are joined, and the Korean name of Yangsuri is Dumulmeori. This is the source of drinking water for Seoul residents. There are many tourist destinations near Yangsuri, including the birthplace of Dasan Jeong Yak-Yong, the great scholar of Joseon in the 18th century. This path is located along Jungang Line, providing easy access. If cyclists get tired, they can get on a train with their bicycles. There are Ungilsan Station, Yangsu Station and Sinwon Station at Jungang Line. Namhangang Bicycle Path is started from Paldangdaegyo.

7-8 Yangsu Station—Yangpyeong Art Museum Certification Center

Distance : 18km / Estimated time : 80 minutes

There is an old tunnel, as this itinerary follows the Jungang Line. There is also a rest area beside the tunnel where riders can take a rest. Yangpyeong, Gyeonggi-do, where the route is located, is well known as a popular destination for leisure sports enthusiasts. Visitors can enjoy riding MTB, ATV, paragliding, horse riding and bungee jumping in Yangpyeong.



Is there a train for cyclists on Jungang Line?

The train for cyclists has been operated on Jungang Line from Yongsan to Yongmun (Deokso) since January 1, 2013. Two of the more than 20 trains on the Line are operated as trains for cyclists. The exterior of the trains are painted with pictures of cyclists. Bicycle holders and folding chairs are installed on the trains to enable riders to sit beside their bicycles. Each of the trains can accommodate 90 bicycles, as they have six passenger cars which can accommodate 15 bicycles each. The trains are operated 12 times a day during weekdays (Yongsan to Deokso : four times, Yongsan to Yongmun : 8 times) and 16 times a day during weekends and holidays (Yongsan to Deokso : four times, Yongsan to Yongmun : 12 times).





8 9 Yangpyeong Art Museum Certification Center – Ipobo Certification Center

Distance : 16km

Estimated time : 60 minutes

Ipobo (Weir), which is called Pasageyeong, Natural Attraction No. 3 of Namhangang, is located on this route. The bicycle path where silver grass dances in the wind from the river adds a romantic mood. There are other tourist destinations located along the river, including Jeonbuk-ri Rest Area and Gaegun Leisure Sports Park, and a number of pretty pensions. Makguksu (Korean buckwheat noodles) Street is located in Cheonso-ri near Ipodaegyo (Bridge), so visitors can enjoy a bowl of Makguksu.

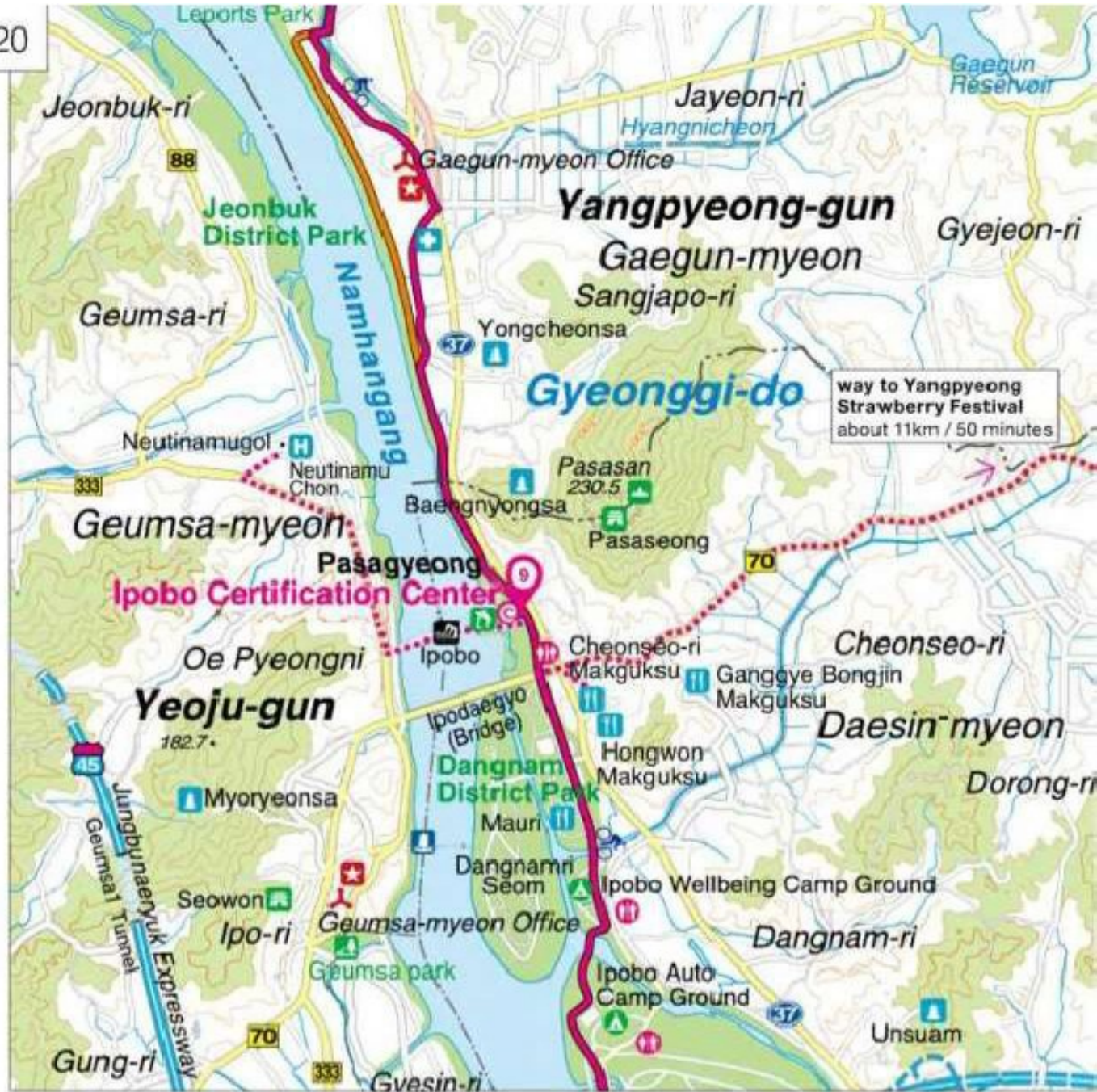


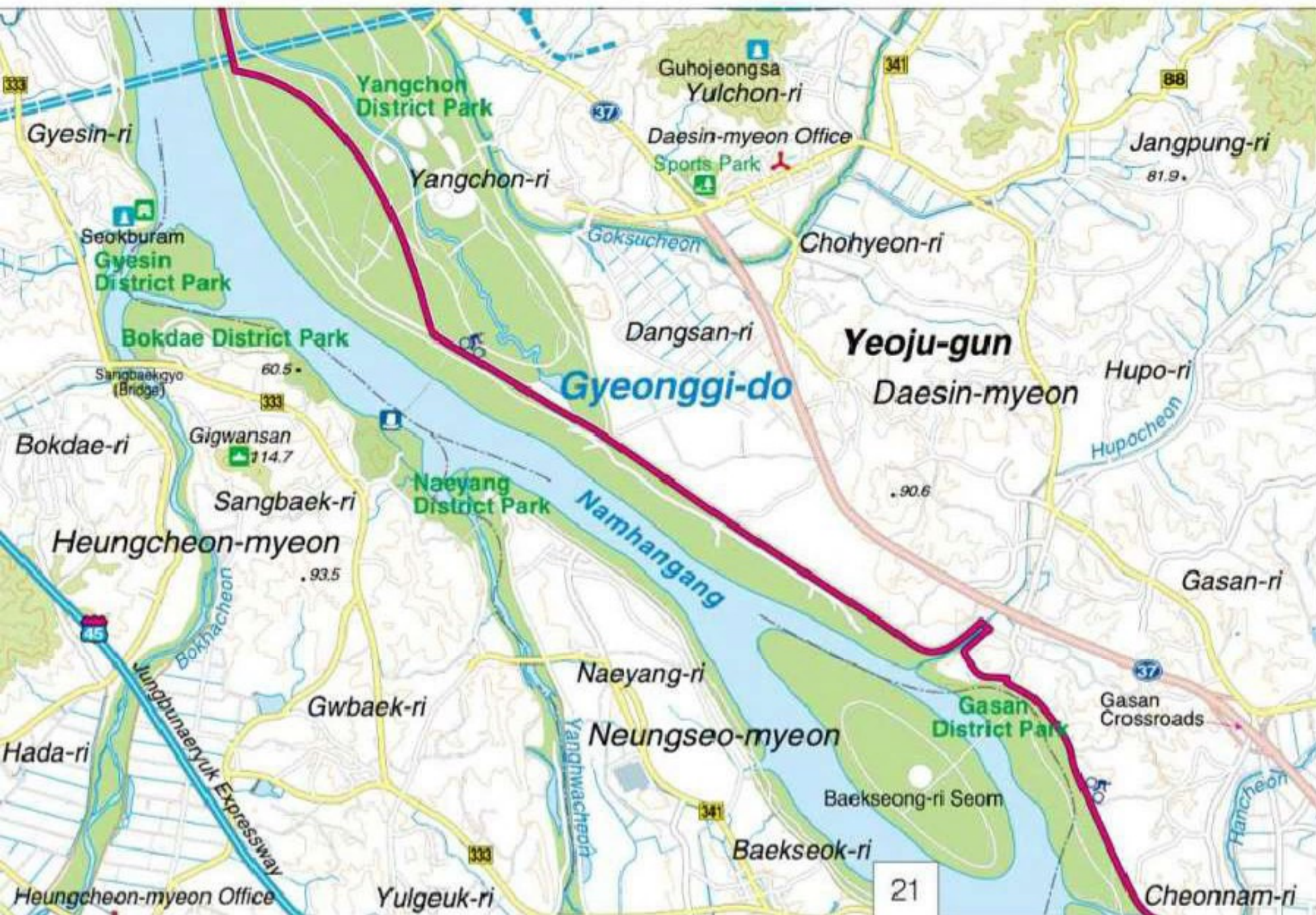


Pasaseong Fortress Site

The stone walls of Pasasan Fortress stretch along the ridge of the 250-meter-high Pasasan Mountain. The fortress is strategically situated for national defense by being located at the edge of the river bank, from which you can see both upstream and downstream. It is said that the fortress was constructed during the reign of the King Pasa, the 5th ruler of the Silla Kingdom. The walls stretch over 1,800 meters in length. At its highest point, the wall is 6.25 meters tall, and 1.4 meters tall at its lowest point.

9 10 Ipobo Certification Center – Yeojudaegyo

Distance : 16km

Estimated time : 70 minutes

When visitors move through the riverside path of Yeoju Detention Pond, where Maze Park and Picnic Place are located, Baekseok-ri Seom (Island) and Yeojubo (Weir), they get close to downtown Yeoju. Yeoju is such a great tourist destination, as Yangseom District Park and Hyeonam District Park near Sejongdaegyo (Bridge) have campgrounds, baseball parks, outdoor exhibition places and eco learning centers. It is only a 16km-long path for bicycles, and visitors are recommended to visit downtown Yeoju to the south and Silleuksa (Temple) to the north.





Yeogang, Namhangang of Yeosu

Residents of Yeosu, Gyeonggi-do, call Namhangang as "Yeogang (River)." This river is named "Yeogang" because it looks like a black horse, and the term is still used to refer to the section of Namhangang more than 40km in length that flows through Yeosu. The ancients recognized Pyeongyang near Daedonggang (River), which is located in North Korea, Chuncheon near Soyanggang (River) in Gangwon-do and Yeosu of Yeogang as the three best riverside villages in Korea. Blessed with beautiful mountains and clear water, Yeosu is also renowned for its rice quality, along with Icheon, the neighboring village.





10 11 Yeojudaegyo – Gangcheon Certification Center

Distance : 12km / Estimated time : 50 minutes

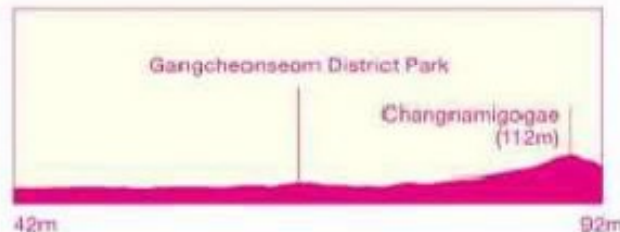
This itinerary is special because visitors can see the remains of old ferries and visit an old temple, Silleuksa. Scholars of the Joseon Dynasty often used the ferries here to travel to take the national examination in Hanyang (Seoul). It is said that there were 12 ferries in Yeosu.



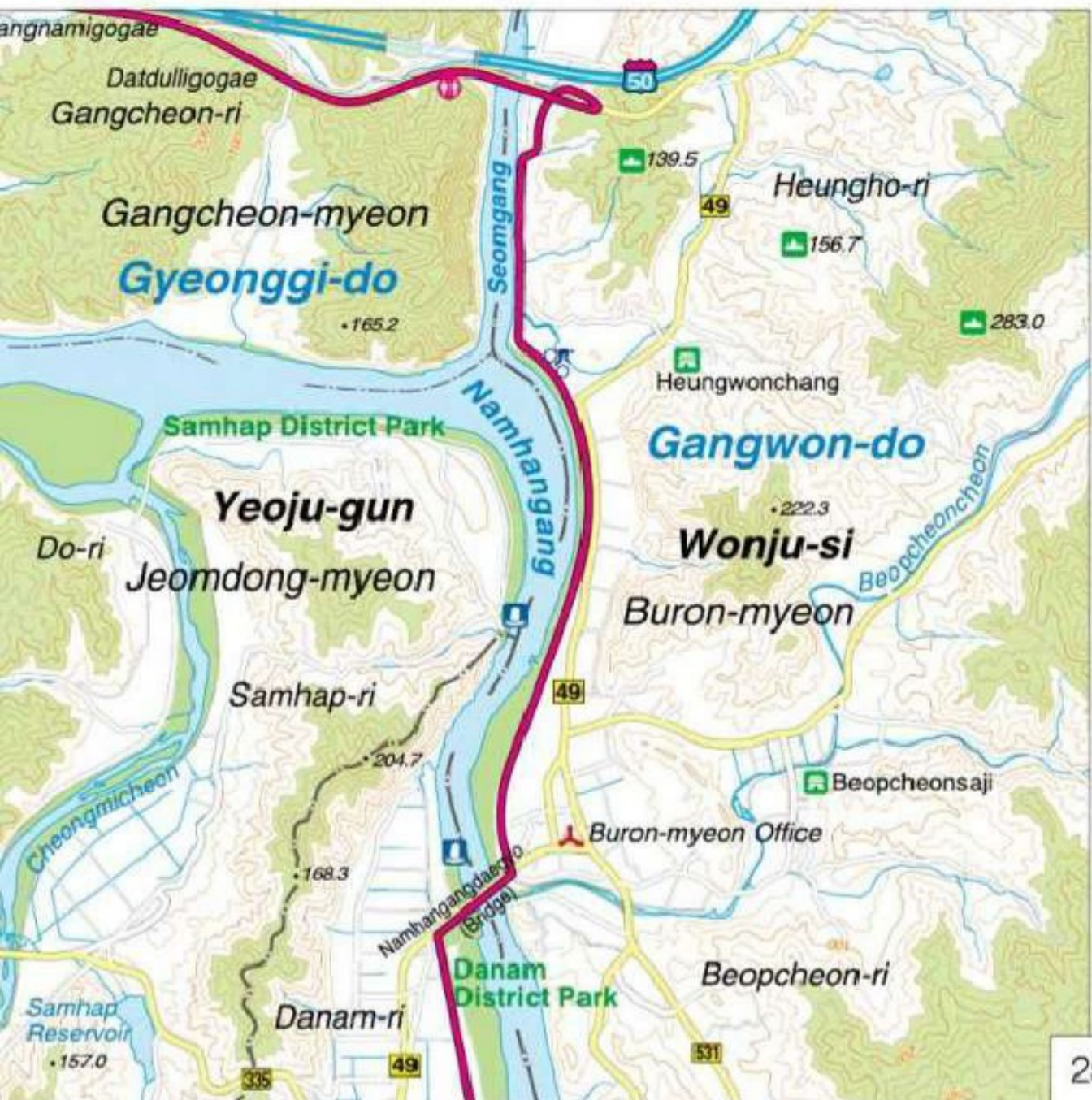


Bicycle Path leading to eight best natural attractions of Yeoju is called the trail of culture

The bicycle path, which is about 28km in length, connects Yeoju and Yeoju World Ceramic Livingware Gallery. As the path leads to Yeongwollu, Geummorae Eunmorae Park, Gangcheonbo (Weir), Mok-A Museum, Silleuksa (Temple) and other tourist destinations of Yeoju, it provides an ideal one-day itinerary for cyclists. It takes only one hour and 30 minutes if you ride non-stop. But visitors are recommended not to rush as the route is filled with interesting attractions. The best eight natural attractions of Yeoju include the evening bell sound of Silleuksa, the lamp of a boat seen in Maamgang (River), the sound of a cuckoo in Yeongneung and the summer showers of Pasananseong (Fortress).

Samhap-ri Island, the rich repository of eco resources

Samhap-ri Island, which is also called Dori Island, is located in Samhap-ri, Jeomdong-myeon, Yeosu. The island is a rich repository of eco resources, including endangered species such as Danyangssukbujaengi (wild grass), Cheungcheung Dunggeulle (medical plant) and Pyobeom Jangjibaem (Mongolian racerunners). Three streams, including the mainstream of Namhangang, Seomgang, and Cheongmicheon (Stream) meet at Samhap-ri, and the name of the village means "meeting of three waters." After it was discovered that the island is a rich repository of rare species, the government announced a policy to preserve the ecosystem of the island.





11 12 Gangcheon Certification Center – Senior Center at Hugok village

Distance : 17km
 Estimated time : 70 minutes
 Namhangangdaegyo (Bridge) borders Gyeonggi-do and Chungcheong-do. Semulmeori, which is just before Namhangangdaegyo, is located at the point where Seomgang (River) from Gangwon-do meets Namhangang, which borders Gyeonggi-do and Chungcheong-do. The point where two rivers meet usually has beautiful scenery. The bicycle path stretches straight from Namhangangdaegyo to Yeongjuk-ri, Yangseong-myeon, Chungju-si, allowing a relaxed, countryside feeling.





12 13 Senior Center at Hugok village – Jojeongjidam

Distance : 20km / Estimated time : 80 minutes

Visitors can ride along a country trail that stretches along Namhangang. The itinerary leads to Binae Island, which is renowned as a habitat for migratory birds, and Angseong Spa Park. The itinerary also allows visitors to observe nature and get some fresh air, as aquatic eco parks are scattered at intervals of a few kilometers along the trail. Neungam-ri Island, Gageum-myeon, Chungju, Bonghwanggyeong, Natural Attraction No. 7 of Namhangang, Mokgye Ferry which was the largest water transportation point of Namhangang in the Joseon Dynasty and Jungwon Goguryeo Monument designated as National Treasure No. 205 are located on the path.

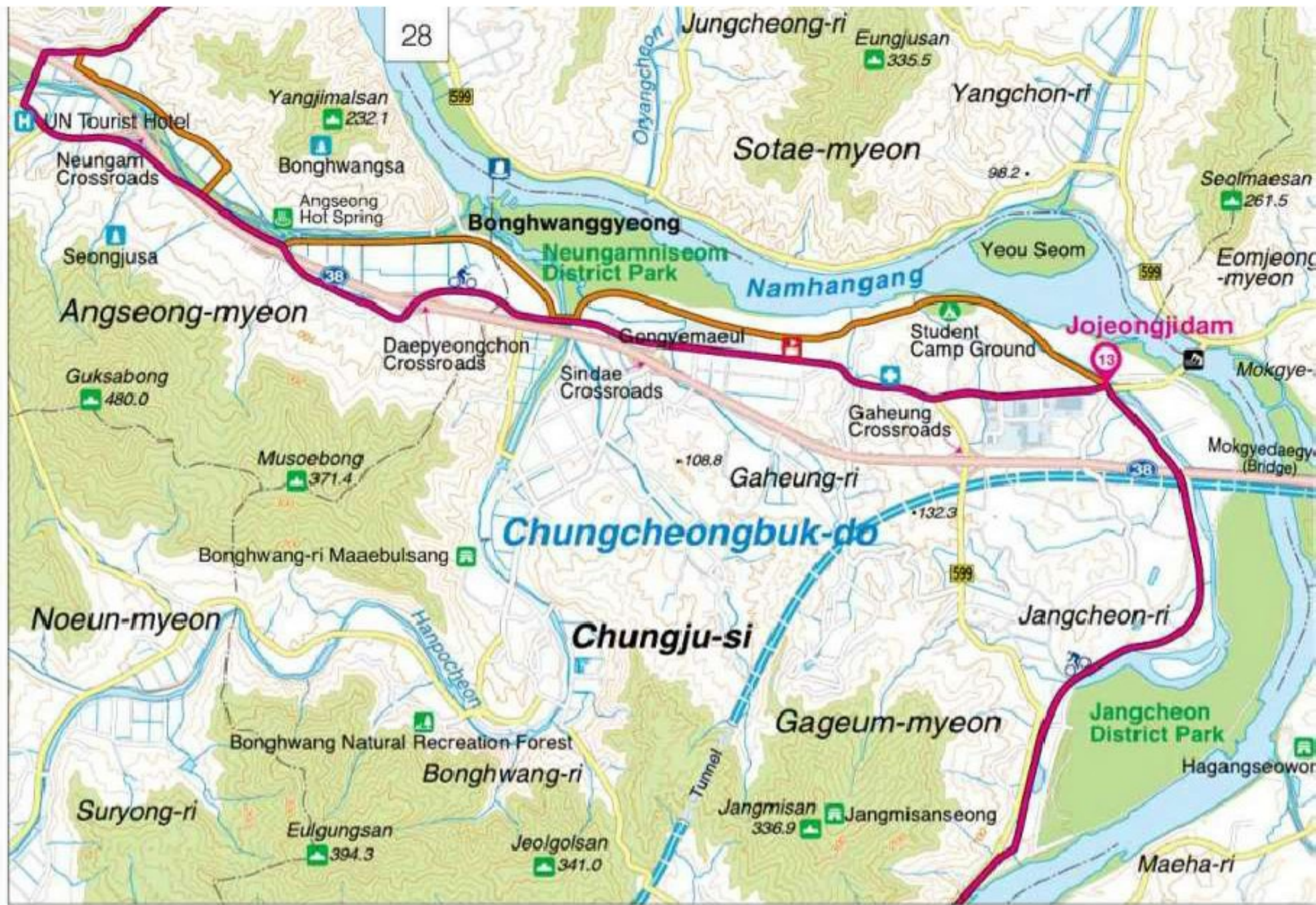


Binae-gil, one of the best riverside paths

There is a 10km-long trail at the side of Namhangang, which connects Angseong-myeon, Chungju, and Sotae-myeon, Chungju. While strolling from Angseong Hot Spring Square, the nation's only carbonated hot spring area, visitors can relax and enjoy.

The path also leads to the riverside trail, Neungam-ri Island and Binae Island, a renowned habitat for migratory birds. With the growing number of amateur photographers visiting the trail, an annual Chungju Binae-gil Photo Festival was launched in September, 2012.

13-14 Jojeongjidam – Chungju Tangeumdae Certification Center


Distance : 10km / Estimated time : 40 minutes

When cyclists go straight toward Tangeumdae without crossing Jojeongjidam and hike along the bicycle path at the riverside, they can see the central tower marking the center of the Korean peninsula. There is a park around the central tower, and there are Liquorium and a habitat for copper-winged bats along the path.



Hwangpo Boats and Ferries

Namhangang had been the major transportation point toward Hanyang (Seoul), the then-capital city, until about 100 years ago, so we can still see the remains of the transportation point at Namhangang, including old ferries and Hwangpo Boats (boats with yellow sails). Facilities such as ferries and Hwangpo Boats were important because Namhangang was the major grain transportation route from the southern part of the country to the government. Now the Hwangpo Boat Experience Program is operated for tourists. The boats are launched at Hwangpo Boat Ferry in Geummorae Eunmorae Park.

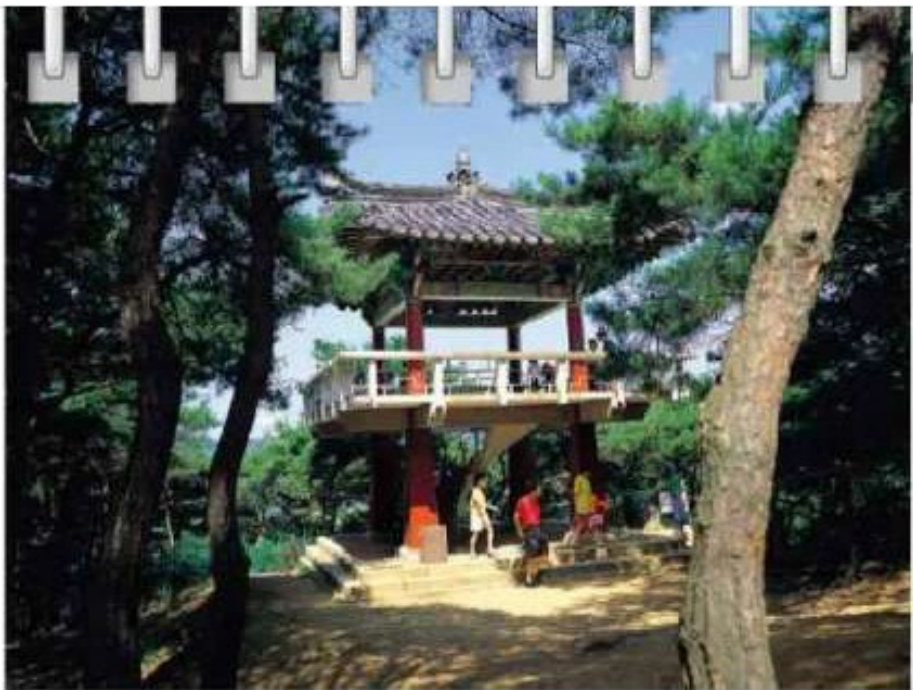

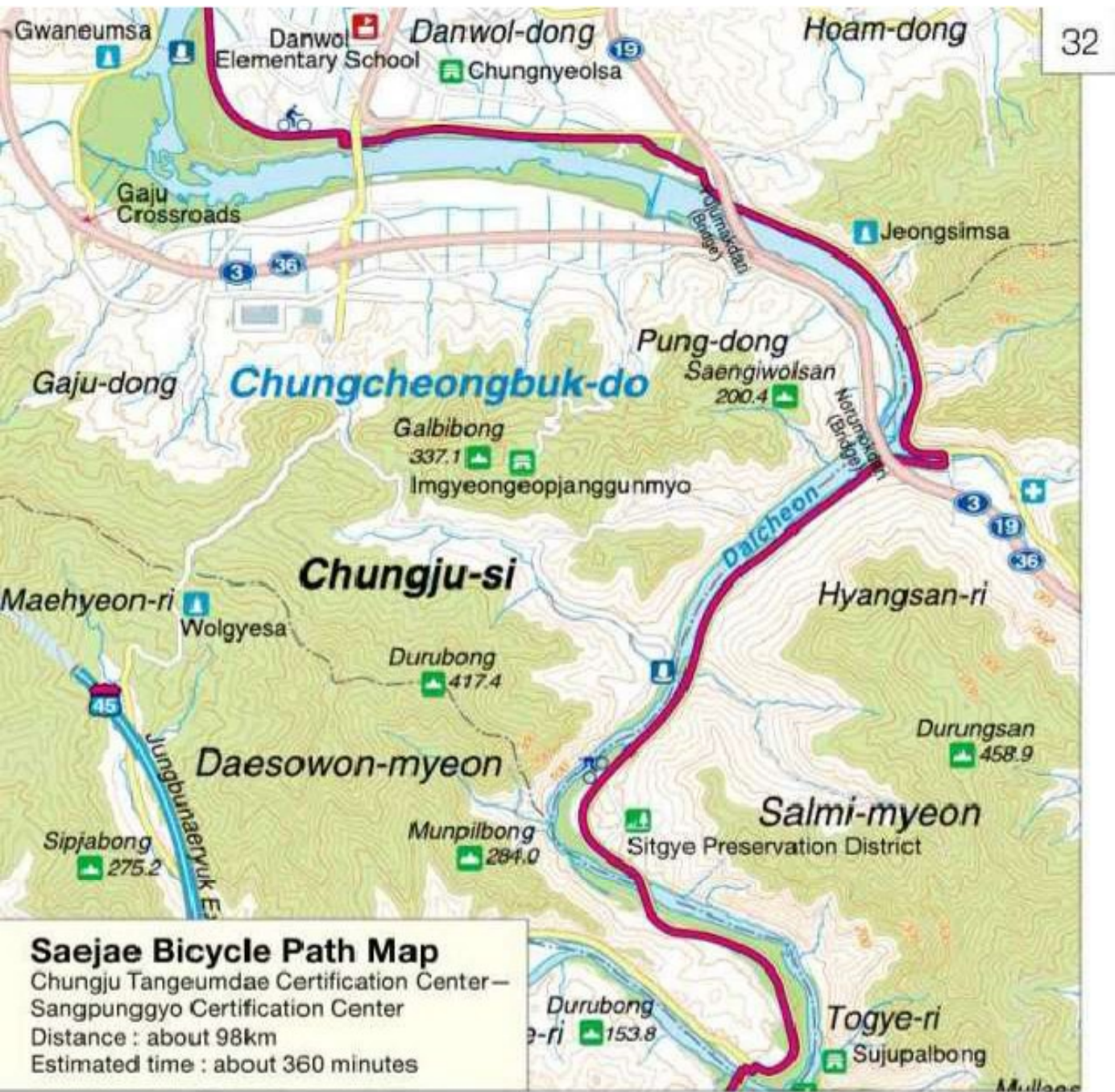

Chungju Tangeumdae

Tangeumdae, which is at the end of the path, is the place where Ureuk, the greatest musician of Silla, one of the three ancient nations of Korea, played Gayageum. To travel further along the bicycle path of Namhangang, cyclists should move to Chungjudam, which is located at the east of Tangeumdae. The path connecting to Sangju along Dalcheon is called Saejae Bicycle Path. Saejae means that the hill is so high that even birds should take a rest at the hill. Saejae Bicycle Path is joined with Nakdonggang Bicycle Path.

14 15 Chungju Tangeumdae Certification Center - Suanbo Oncheon Certification Center

Distance : 27km / Estimated time : 90 minutes
 The bicycle path along Dalcheon (Stream) is an ideal path for cyclists, as there are few cars and the path has great scenery. A stone marking the Sitgye Preservation District on Palbonghyangsan Path promotes the fact that the area is one of the best eco repositories. The bicycle path on National Road 3 connecting Chungju and Sangju has guardrails to separate the bicycle path, guaranteeing the safety of cyclists.

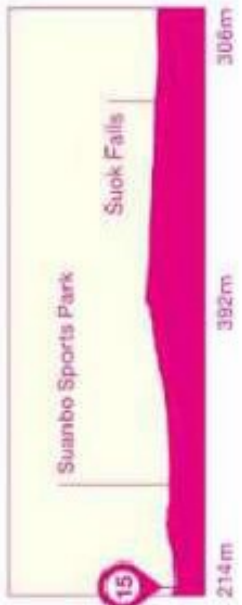


Chungjuho

Chungjuho is a multi-purpose lake made by a river dam. This large lake is very clean and well-preserved. At the Chungjudam Ferry Dock, ferries depart to follow the waterways of Chungjuho (Lake). The ferry travels to Oksunbong, Gudambong, and Manhakcheonbong Peaks, Choga Rock, Whale Rock, Hyeonhakbong, Onodong, Sinseonbong, Gangseondae, Beodeulbong, Oseongam, Seolmabong, Jebibong, and Dumusan to reach its final destination at Sindanyang Dock. When the ferry draws near Cheongpung Ferry Dock, you can see the second highest water fountain in Asia. 📍 Jongmin-dong, Chungju-si, Chungcheongbuk-do

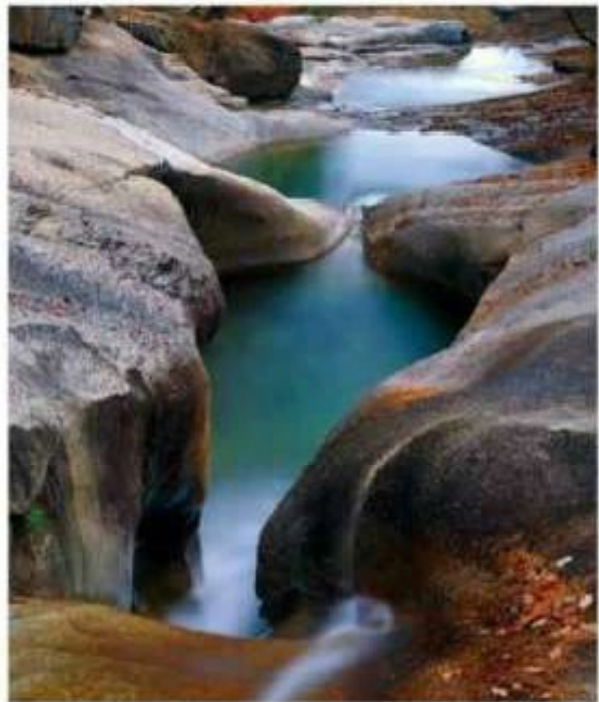




Suanbo, the hot spring with the history of 1,000 years

Suanbo is one of Korea's most famous hot springs, and has been a popular tourist destination since the Goryeo Dynasty. According to the Annals of the Joseon Dynasty, Taejo Lee Seonggye (the first king of Joseon Dynasty) used to visit Suanbo to treat his dermatitis, and Suanbo has been called "the hot spring of the King" ever since. Formal presidents of Korea like Rhee Syngman, Park Chung-hee and Choi Kyu-hah also visited Suanbo, and it was one of Korea's most significant tourist attractions in the 1970s and 1980s. The thermal water naturally flowing out from the rock formation 250m deep is weakly alkaline and 53°C. The water is full of minerals and has very effective dermatitis and neuralgia. ☎ 043-846-3605.



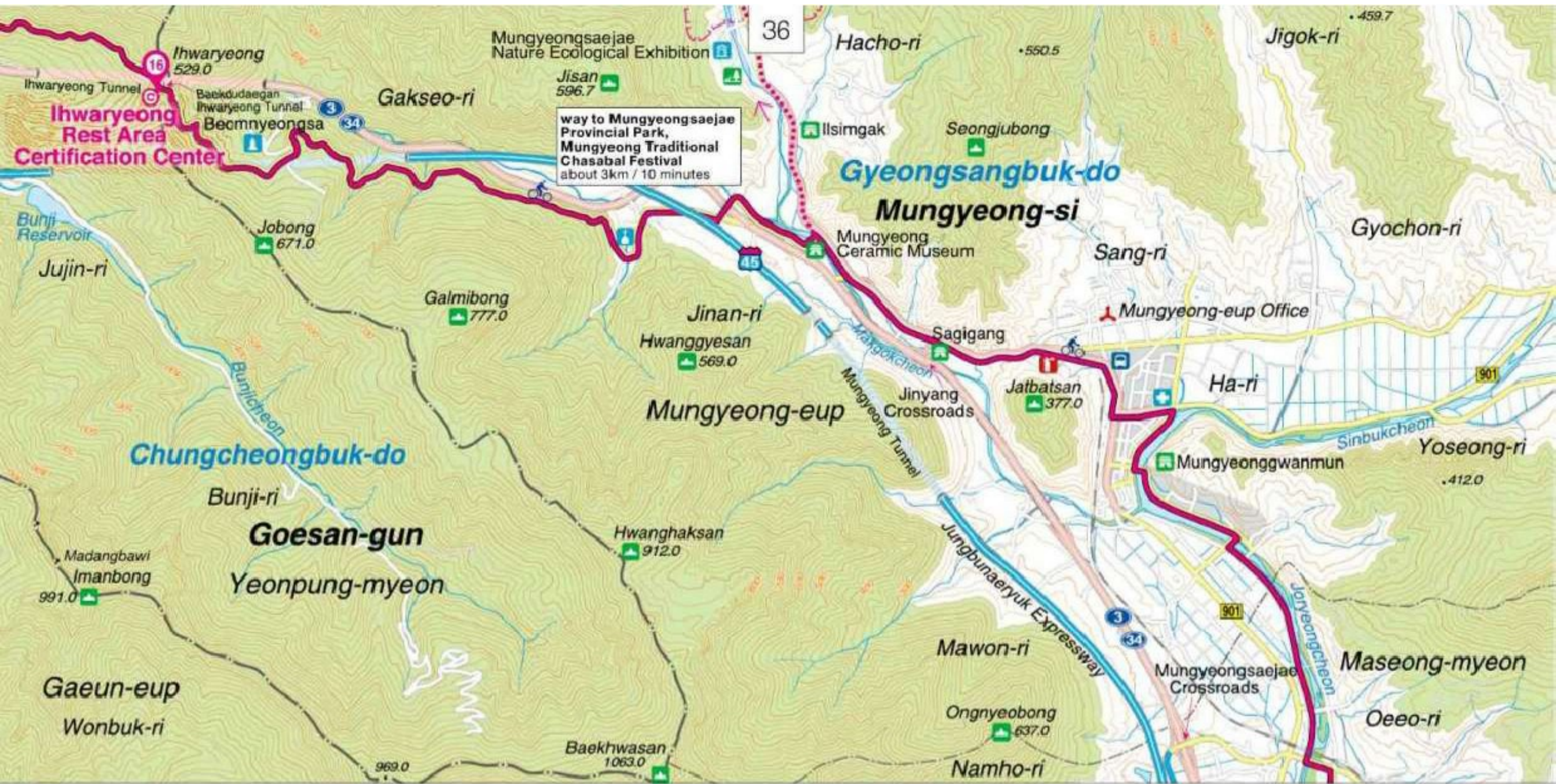

15 16 Suanbo Certification Center – Ihwaryeong Rest Area Certification Center

Distance : 17km
 Estimated time : 70 minutes
 This route provides the most rugged option in Saejae Bicycle Path, because it leads to Ihwaryeong, which is 548m high. Ihwaryeong, which borders Chungcheongbuk-do and Gyeongsangbuk-do, was long known as a place where hikers were at risk of being attacked by animals due to the rugged terrain. Sojoryeong, which is 374m high, is located at the middle of the trail, and the rest area is installed at Sojoryeong. Since this section of riding course is very challenging, compared to other bicycle paths.

Saejae Bicycle Path

Saejae Bicycle Path connects Tangeumdaegyo located in front of Tangeumdae, Chungju, and Sangpunggyo, Sangju. It is named after Mungyeongsaekjae, the best tourist attraction in Chungju, but it is actually located on Ihwaryeong. The path is quite special, as it passes through country roads and farming roads instead of national roads, providing an eco-friendly path. The bicycle path is clearly marked in red at the crossroads, allowing riders to easily identify which way to take. The path begins at Jebang-gil, Hahang-cheon near Chungju Wastewater Treatment Center, and there are rest areas for bicycle paths along the path. There are some gravel roads, so please be aware of traveling through driveways.



16 17 Ihwaryeong Rest Area Certification Center – Buljeong Station Certification Center

Distance : 22km
 Estimated time : 90 minutes
 Ihwaryeong borders Geosan, Chungcheongbuk-do and Mungyeong, Gyeongsangbuk-do. If you climb Ihwaryeong, which is the highlight of Saejae Bicycle Path, the downhill path leads to Mungyeong. The downhill slope is steep until you reach Saejaegyo, Mungyeong, so it is recommended to carefully check your brakes and control your speed for safety. The flatland is unfolded from Mungyeongsaejae Provincial Park. Move toward Mungyeong-eup instead of heading toward Mungyeonsaejae Provincial Park.





Mungyeong Railbike installed along the bicycle path

This is a tourist attraction in Mungyeong that was built using the railroad of Gaeun Line, which was previously used to transport coal from Jeomchon, the downtown area, to Gaeun, where anthracite mines were located. There are a total of three courses, including the 4km long round trip course from Jinnam Station to Buljeong Station, the 3.6km long round trip course from Buljeong Station to Jupyeong and the 4km long round trip course from Gaeun Station to Meokbaengyi Station. Jinnam Station, Buljeong Station and Gaeun Station, where train operations were suspended, were transformed into railbike terminals.

17 18 Buljeong Station Certification Center – Yeongsunggyo

Distance : 14km
 Estimated time : 50 minutes
 The path is located along Yeongnamdaero, Mungyeongsaejae, which was built in the early Joseon Dynasty. Riders can see some unique views of Jinnamgyoban, which is full of strange rocks, bizarre stones and giddy cliffs. The path provides easy transportation options as it is adjacent to downtown Mungyeong, where Jeomchon Station and Jeomchon Terminal are located.





18-19 Yeongsungyo – Sangpunggyo Certification Center

Distance : 18km / Estimated time : 60 minutes

We can enjoy the relaxed mood of the countryside at the final section of Saejae Bicycle Path, which passes through farming roads. The entire section is located in Sangju, Gyeongsangbuk-do, and Sangju City won the Most Beautiful Bicycle Path Award for its excellent maintenance and management of this section and Nakdonggang Bicycle Path. Cyclists can enjoy convenience facilities and safety facilities throughout this section. While resting in the shade of Pine Forest of Taebong-ri and reaching Toegang-ri, which means "village located at the backside of the river," where Saejae Bicycle Path ends.

National Museum of Korea

The National Museum of Korea is the nation's largest national museum, and preserves and exhibits many of Korea's most important cultural assets. Noryangjin Fisheries Wholesale Market

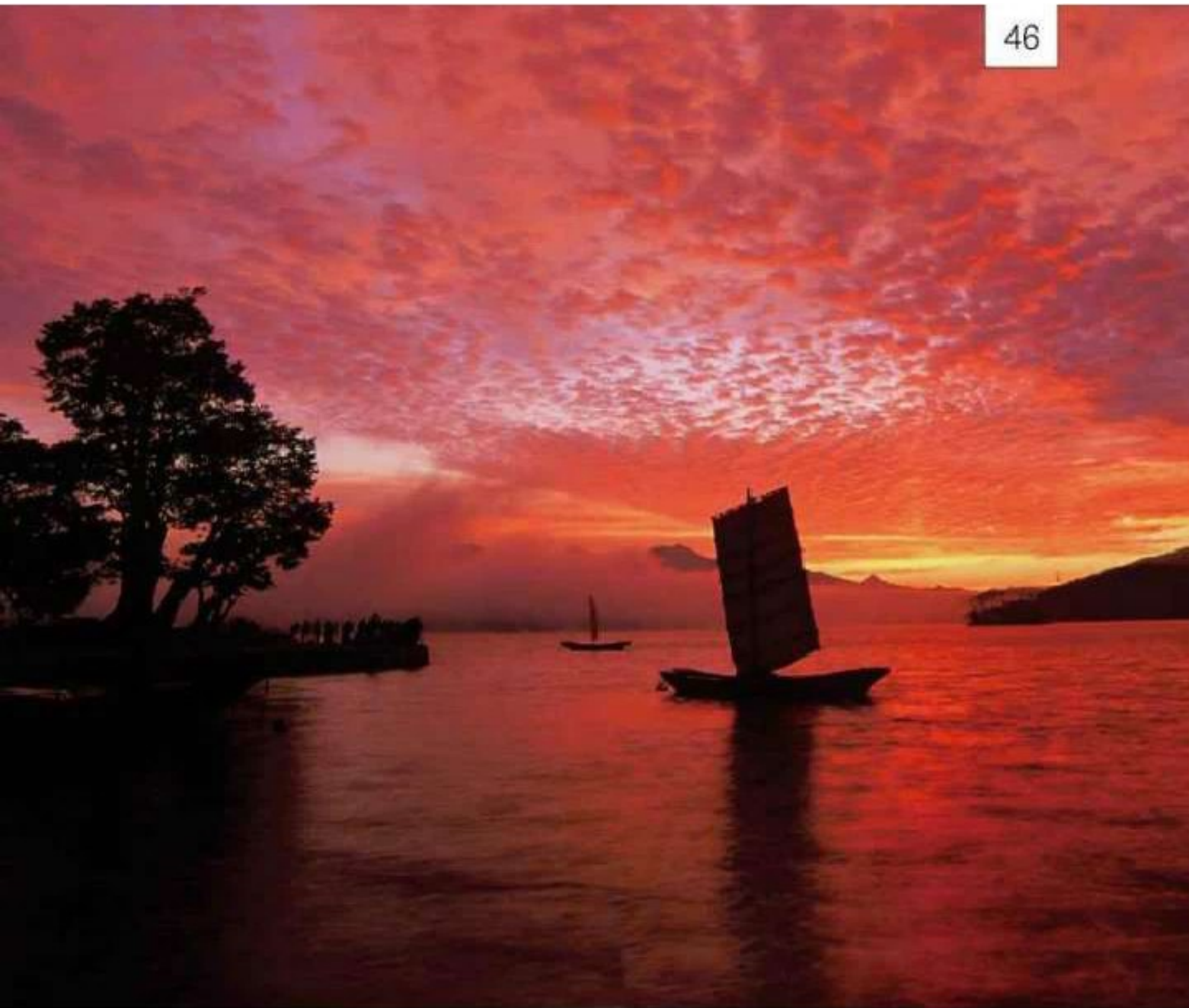

There are three legendary boundary gates of Mungyeongsaejae Provincial Park, on rough mountaintops, which are reputed to be too tall for even birds to fly over. Mungyeongsaejae, which overlays Joryeongsan (Mt.), has always been the highest and most dangerous mountain pass. It was cleared during the time of Kim Taejong of Joseon Dynasty, and was used until a new road was built through the Ihwaryeong Gogae Pass. 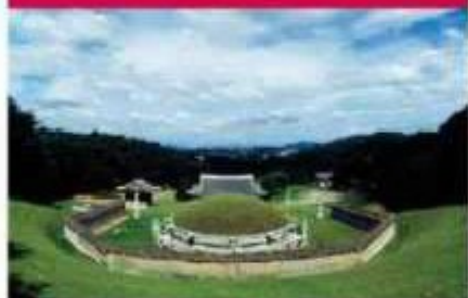

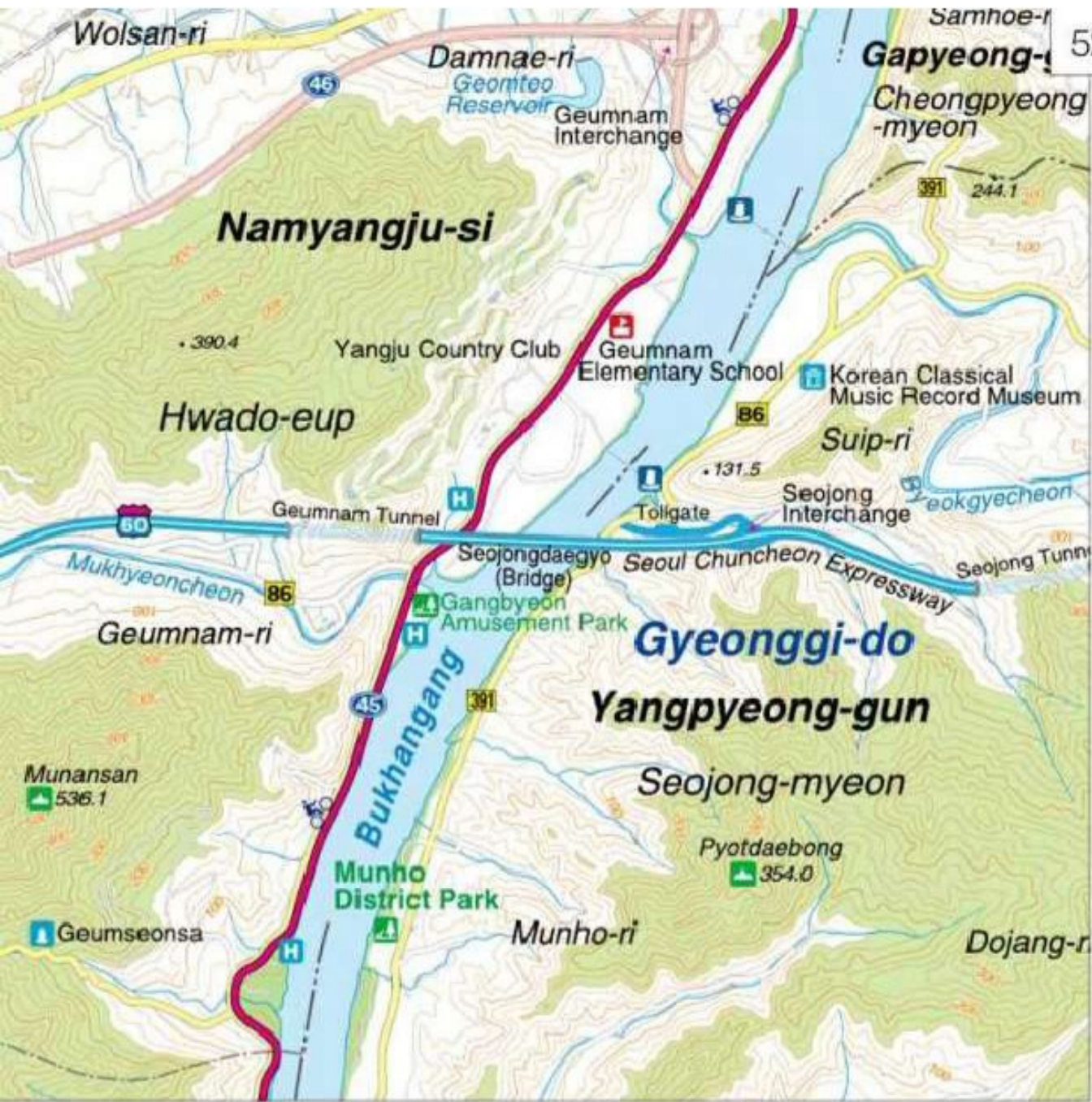
Cyclists can reach Ungilsan Station, the starting point of this course, by train. Bukhangang Bicycle Path begins at Balgeungwangjang (Square) under the railroad bridge. Cyclists begin their trips by getting a certification stamp at the red box at the starting point. It is important to wisely control the conditions, as there are small hills and downhill sections in this course. Extra care should be taken, as there is a short section where cyclists will need to use the shoulder of a narrow road.





Bukhangang Bicycle Path : The Most Popular One-Day Itinerary among Korean Cyclists

Bukhangang Bicycle Path, which connects to Namyangju near Seoul and Chuncheon in Gangwon-do, is about 80km long. Cyclists can enjoy a beautiful river view that changes with the season, see mountains and rivers and meet residents. Cyclists can reach the starting point by train on weekends, and return to Seoul from their destination by train. It is convenient as cyclists can return by train from any train station. There are small towns along the trail, so there are many restaurants and rest areas, as well as many tourist destinations that are popular among Korean college students, including Daeseong-ri, Cheongpyeong, Gapyeong and Gangchon. Cyclists can enjoy a one-day trip that offers beautiful views of Korea's rivers and small towns.



21 22 Daeseong-ri Station – Cheongpyeong Amusement Park

Distance : 10km / Estimated time : 40 minutes

The course is even, but it requires some extra care as there is a section where cyclists are required to use the shoulder of the road. The course has a wide river view. There is no special tourist destination, but the course provides fun riding experiences. Cyclists can see Cheongpyeongdam at the right side after passing under Sincheongpyeongdaegyo (Bridge). Cyclists move away from Namhangang toward Cheongpyeong-myeon. There are high mountains near Namhangang (River), so it is an extremely challenging course. Cheongpyeong-myeon is a small town, but it is a popular destination for aquatic sports fans and anglers.





The Romantic Gyeongchun Line Became a Bicycle Path

Gyeongchun Line connects Seoul and Chuncheon. Operation of the railroad was launched in 1939, and provided access to all tourist destinations in Gyeonggi-do and Gangwon-do, including Daeseong-ri, Cheongpyeong, Gapyong and Chuncheon. In particular, the Line was popular among college students. When Gyeongchun Line became a double-track line in 2010 and new subway stations were built, the previous railroads and stations were no longer in use. The abandoned railroad of Gyeongchun Line was remade as a bicycle path early this year. The trail is over 40km long, and connects to Namyangju and Gapyeong-gun. The unsightly railroad, bridges and tunnels that had fallen out of use were revitalized as romantic tourist spots, and new rest areas and squares were also built. Cyclists can use Gyeongchun Line or ITX, the semi-high speed train.



Cheongpyeong Amusement Park

Cheongpyeong Amusement Park are located near Jojongcheon (Stream), which is a tributary of Bukhangang (River) flowing through Cheongpyeong-myeon, the destination of this section. It is a famous summering spot as it is adjacent to Seoul. Cheongpyeongho (Lake) built with Cheongpyeongdam is about 3km away from Cheongpyeong Amusement Park, and is a popular aquatic leisure destination for many city dwellers. There are many good maewuntang (spicy fish soup) restaurants here.

Gyeongganggyo Certification Center**

Distance : 17km / Estimated time : 70 minutes

Mount Homyoneg (Height : 535m) is at the right side. The name of the mountain means "mountain where the cry of a tiger can be heard." Cheongpyeong Pumped Storage Power Plant is located at the top of Mountain Homyeong. The trail to the power plant is a popular mountain bike trail. Cyclists can enjoy typical Korean views while traveling the course. Passing Sangcheon Station, there is a section that was completed by renovating an old railroad. There is a high hill in the course, but it provides the unique experience of passing through the old train tunnel on a bike. After passing through the tunnel, there is a long decline that lasts for 3km.



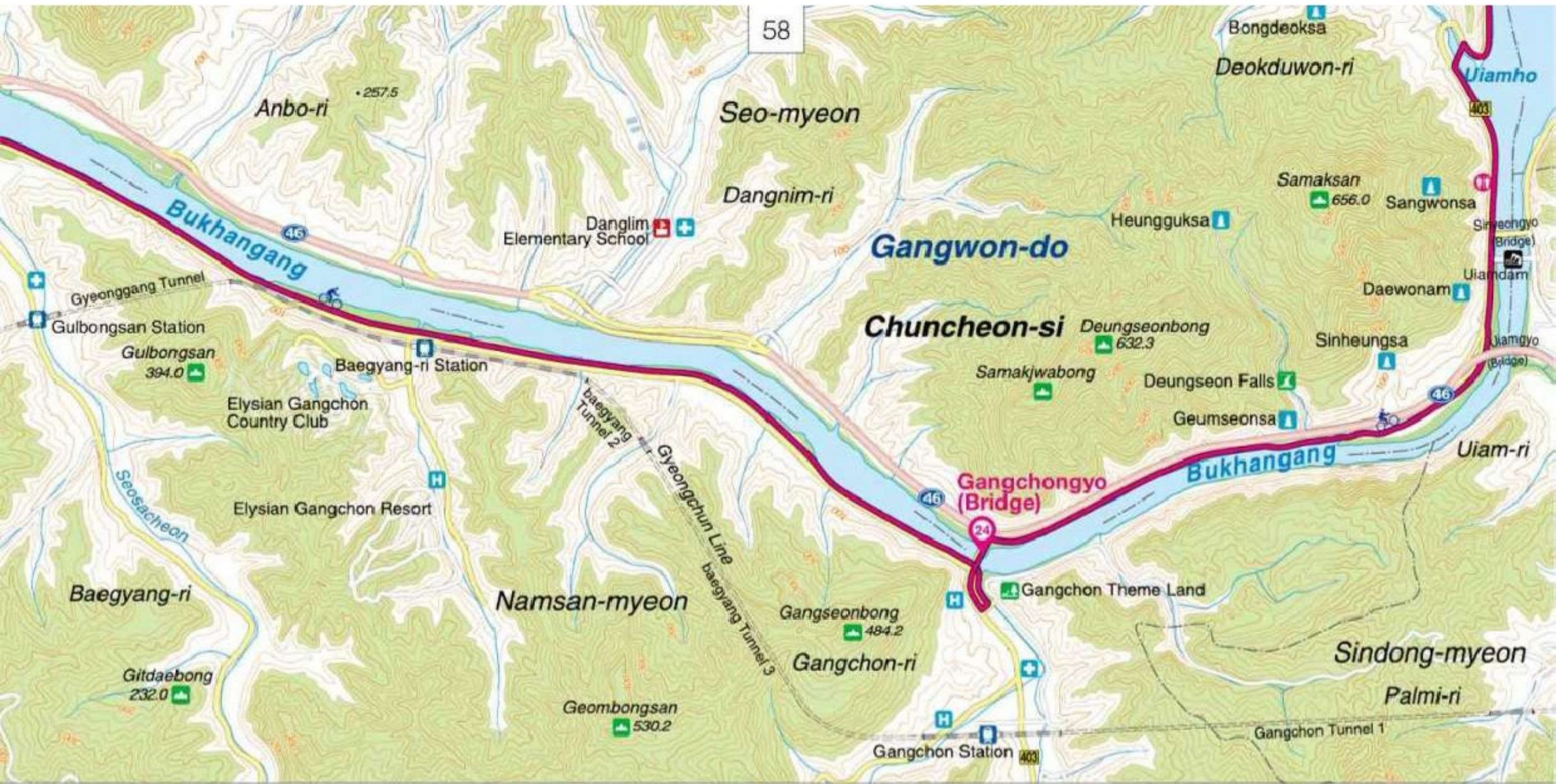
23-24 Gyeongganggyo Certification Center – Gangchongyo

Distance : 13km / Estimated time : 50 minutes

Gyeongganggyo (Bridge), which is connected with Gapyeong 2-gyo (Bridge), is at the border of Gyeonggi-do and Gangwon-do. After crossing the bridge, cyclists are required to turn right. Extra care should be taken here, as there is a steep slant with a sharp curve. Now we are in Gangwon-do, which is renowned for its rugged mountains. The bicycle path built along Bukhangang, which flows through high mountains, is relatively even, enabling cyclists to enjoy river views. There is a resort town, Gangchon, at the end of the course, with many accommodation options and leisure options including railbike, bicycle hiking, ATV and scooter riding.









Namiseom, a New World in Chuncheon

To enter Namiseom (Island), which is called “the Republic of Nami,” a visitor must present a visa. After paying a visa issuance charge, which is essentially an admission fee, a visitor can enter the island on a boat. The visitor can also get in Sky Line Zip-wire instead of a boat, but this is offered only when one visitor is entering the island. This is quite a popular option! The popular TV drama called Winter Sonata made the island famous. Many tourists now visit Namiseom thanks to the Korean Wave. Visitors can ride a bike on the Dawn Redwood Trail, and can also ride an electronic bike or a Sky Line.

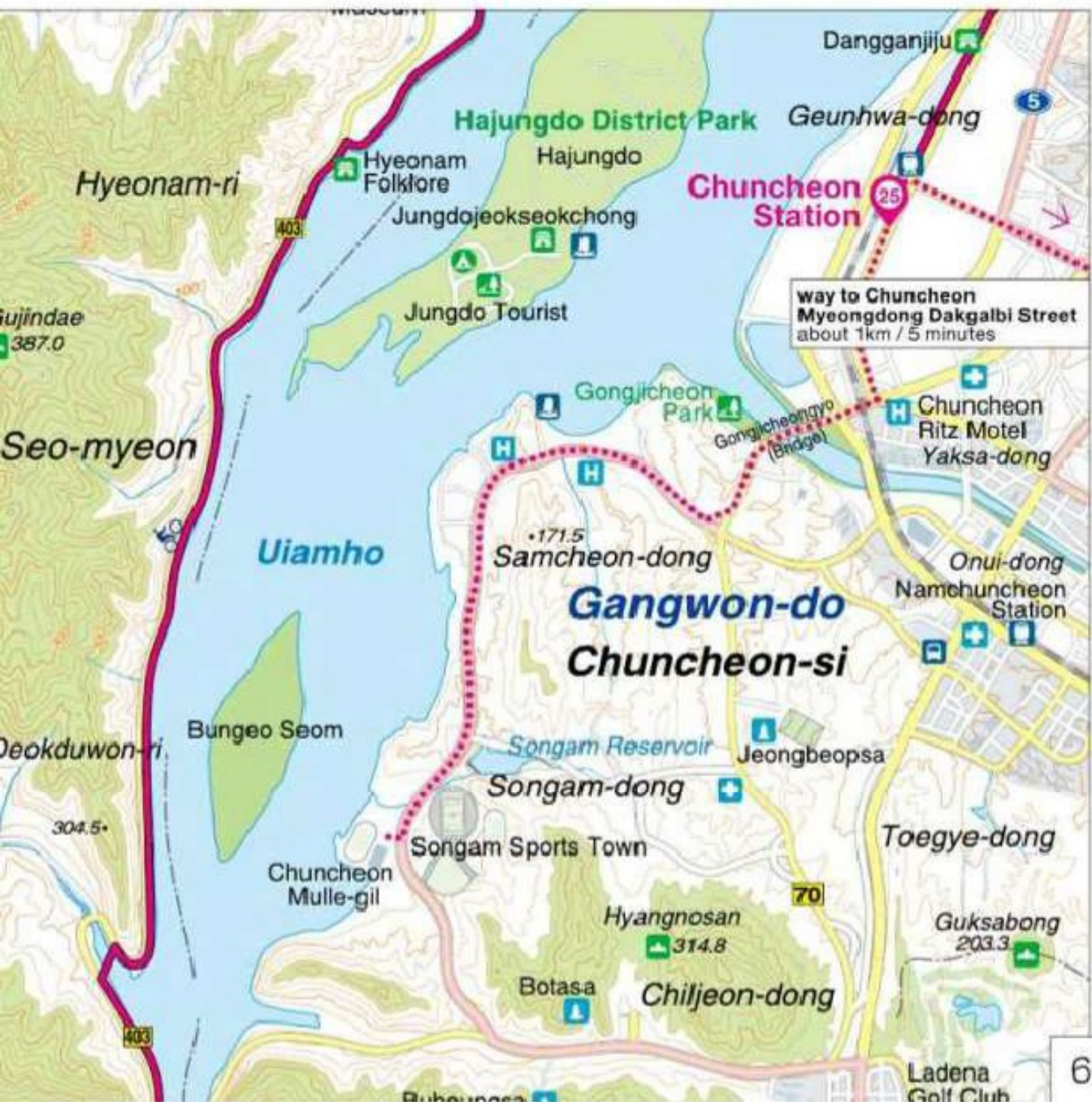
24 — 25 Gangchongyo — Chuncheon Station

Distance : 24km

Estimated time : 100 minutes

This section is considered by many to be the highlight of Bukhangang Bicycle Path. The curved bicycle path is located along the shores of Soyangho (Lake) and Euiamho (Lake), which are renowned for having a beautiful view throughout the year. The course boasts the best-arranged bicycle path among all sections of Bukhangang (River) Bicycle Path. Solid barricades are installed at the bicycle path by the national highway. The bicycle path was completed with an exclusive path at narrow sections. In particular, wooden decks were installed at the section connecting Sinmaedaegyo (Bridge).





Two Ways to Travel Chuncheon on a Bike

There are two recommended hiking courses in Chuncheon, the Euiamho (Lake) Circulation Course and the Gangchon Circulation Course. The Euiamho Circulation Course is about 26km long, and starts at Euiamdang and returns to Euiamdang via Seo-myeon, Hoban Park and Sinmaedaegyo (Bridge). The Gangchon Circulation Course is about 25km long and circulates Gangchon Resort Areas and Jaraseom (Island). The former has many Chuncheon tourist destinations including Animation Museum, Chuncheon Puppet Theatre, Gongjicheon (Stream) Resorts and Songam Sports Town, while the latter



provides a beautiful natural setting with Elysian Gangchon Resorts, Ganchon Resorts, Gulbongsan (Mt.) and Samaksan (Mt.). The two courses are connected, so cyclists can enjoy a fantastic view of Bukhangang along the courses with a total length of about 51km. The two courses are equipped with a well-arranged infrastructure including bicycle paths and rest areas, so cyclists can enjoy safe and convenient riding.

Gapyeong Sledding Hills operates from the beginning of December to March 1st. 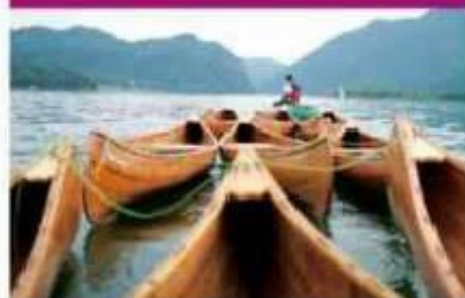

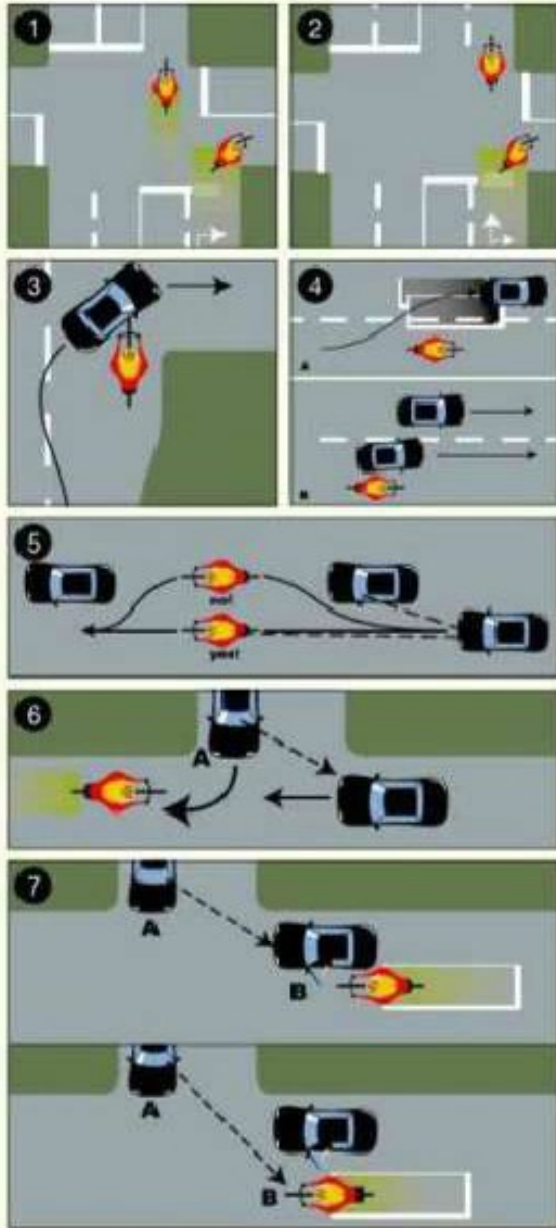

How to Use the Unattended Certification Centers

- 1 First, check that there is a stamp in the booth.
- 2 Then, stamp your passport on the corresponding page.
- 3 Just in case you need more evidence to prove that you were really there, take a photo in front of the booth!





When riding on the road

- 1 If there is a right turn lane, shift to the other lane and pass through.
- 2 If one lane allows both a right turn and to go straight, ride on the left side of the right lane.
- 3 If you stay on the right side of the right lane, you may crash with a vehicle that is turning right.
- 4 If the lane is narrow, it is safer to ride on the center lane (A) rather than riding on the right side of the lane (B).
- 5 It is dangerous to ride moving in and out of the spaces between parked cars.
- 6 The directions that the dotted lines show are the drivers' usual direction of sight. Driving the wrong way in this case is dangerous because there is possibility for a head-on collision with the car taking a right turn.
- 7 Driver A may not see the bike rider due to vehicle B. Also, you must ride at least 1m away from vehicle B in case the driver door.
