CIVITAS National/regional Networks (CIVINETs) expand further across Europe

The CIVITAS National/regional Networks (collectively known as the CIVINETs) bring together cities and other stakeholders to share CIVITAS lessons and experience in their own language.

Since the start of the CIVITAS-CAPITAL Support Action on 1st September 2013, the number of CMINETs has now doubled from 5 to 10. The newer Established Networks CIVINET networks include Slovenia-Croatia, German-speaking countries, Francophone Czech Republic & Slovakia, Hungary Spain &Portugal and Poland, giving a coverage of 17 UK - Ireland PL (7) Member States in total. Netherlands & Flanders DE-AT-CH-LI **New Networks** HU (8) FR-BE-CH Slovenia & Croatia CZ - SK (6) Hungary Czech Republic & Slovakia SI-HR (64) German Speaking ES-PT (31) Coverage of 17 Member States in total with 225 members across Europe *(7): number of members

Sava River Bike Route



- Connecting 4 countries (Si, Cro, B&H, Srb) and 3 national capitals:
 Ljubljana, Zagreb and Beograd plus Banja Luka the capital of Republika Srpska (a part of the B&H federation)
- It is mainly parallel to highway and railway corridor Jesenice Belgrade with important lateral transport corridors to the South (access to Adrialonian Region)
- Not a "cycle path" but a cycling route on different types of infrastructure:
 - existing regional and local road infrastructure,
 - maintenance roads on anti-flood and hydro PP accumulation dams.
 - existing and new cycling paths
- It should avoid high risk conflicts with other users of the infrastructure: Identifying and solving of so called "black spots" is of crucial importance!



Sava Rivier Bike Route Tourism potential



 Tourism is one of the few branches that grow even in times of crises.

14 millions of registered "trekking" cyclists in Germany and 9 millions in the UK

- The route passes through attractive cities and towns of different size and protected areas of natural and cultural heritage.
- The route is envisaged as a main "cycling corridor" that connects existing and developing local cycling networks
- it should provide a possibility for development and marketing of different regional and local cycling tourism products not only aside the Sava river but also in hinterlands.







Sava River Bike Route Goals:



- Increased share of cycling in urban, suburban and tourist transport by improved access to and from urban centres by bike.
- Improved access of recreation and tourist cyclist to natural and cultural heritage spots and attractive landscapes by improved infrastructure, signposting and ICT support.
- Improved co-modality of cycling, rail, bus and river boat transport.
- **Development of cycling tourism** by setting standards, certification schemes and promotion tools.
- Promotion of cycling as a:
 - Healthy and environmental friendly daily actvity even when carried out for utility purpose
 - Accessible form of recreation and tourism that enables high quality free time activitites and experiences of open spaces, nature values and cultural heritage.

CIVINET Slovenija & Hrvatsi

Guiding principles:

- Unified concept based on requirements and best practices of long-distance tourist cycling routes regarding planning of infrastructure and services for cyclists.
- Understanding of cycling as a system that consists from spatial and transport planning, infrastructure, services and communication, promotion & marketing
- Safety, Attractiveness, Comfort and Directness of cycling connections.
- Balanced and complementary approcah to cycling as a part of transport system and cycling tourism.
- Recognisibility and visibility based on corporate identity of the product.
- Cetification of the products based on ADFC certification principles and standards.





Sava Rivier Bike Route State of the art

C i V i N E T CIVITAS City Networks CIVINET Slovenija & Hrvatska

Slovenia:

- High quality cycling path in upper Sava valley 30 km financed by Phare 98/CBC Slovenia-Austria as a part of regional "Three Countries Cycling Paths" project - very positive impact on tourism development in already tourist developed area
- Potential of **low density traffic local roads** from Žirovnica to Litija.
- **Bottleneck**: narrow valley between Litija and Hrastnik (30 km): no feasible solution unless the chain of PP on "middles Sava River" will be constructed (within 10 20 years)
- Construction of hydro PP dams in Posavje region (lower Sava from Slovenian perspective) as an opportunity for direct, safe and comfortable cycling infrastructure.







Sava Rivier Bike Route State of the art

Croatia:

- Few km of cycling paths along the Sava river as a part of 16 km long Svetonedeljska cycling path north of Zagreb.
- Large project of cycling routes around the city of Zagreb
- **80 km of signed cycling routes** on low density traffic local roads at Lonjsko polje natural park.
- Large potential of low density traffic local and field roads along the whole route.

- Centre of Protection of Living Environment from Banja Luka is coordinating EMW and EuroVelo activities on the national level
- CPLE under umbrella of the International Sava River Bassin Commission carried out Sava River Bike Demo Tour



- 7,5 km of a cycling path along the Sava River in Belgrade
- Annual cycling promotion event along the Sava River: cycling from Belgarde to Obrenovac
